Pooled Money Investment Account Monthly Portfolio Composition ⁽¹⁾ 4/30/25 \$172.8 billion

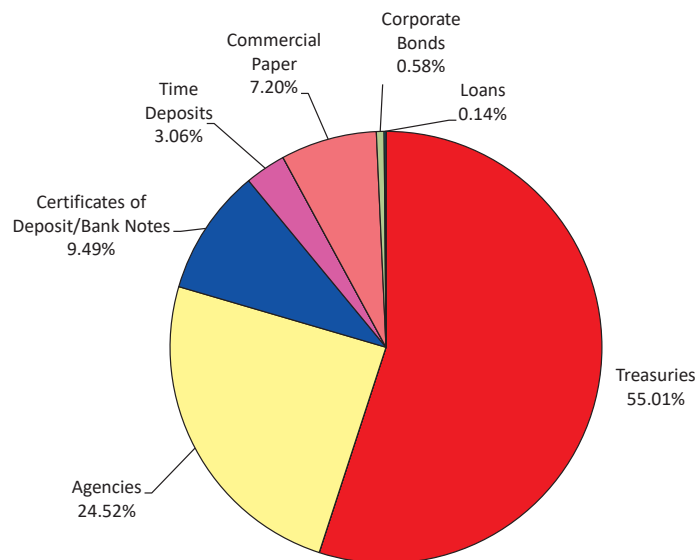

Enhanced Lexis Staff Account

\$10,788.00

The library purchases a Lexis subscription for staff that is separate from and includes more coverage than the patron access we provide to the public.

We would like to (1) add a user and (2) purchase access to the Lexis + AI module. Neither Lexis or Westlaw make their AI platforms available to public libraries for use by the general public, but they will allow us to purchase access for professional librarians. Staff should receive training on and start using at least one of these platforms so that if and when they are made available to our users, we will have experience with them.

Network Redesign & Upgrade

\$19,513.27

The library's current network setup is over 18 years old, dating back to the last building expansion. Since then, how we use technology has changed significantly—more devices, higher data usage, and greater security needs. We have made various updates and changes to the system over time, but have not had a comprehensive review.

We recently brought in a network expert to evaluate our current system. Their assessment found several areas that need improvement to bring us up to contemporary best practices. The are three main components:

- 1) Redundancy for reliability: split the network into two segments, each with its own internet connection and servers. This means that if one side goes down, the other can keep working. This would help ensure that we stay up and running even if something fails
- 2) Faster communication with fiber connections: upgrade the way our servers talk to each other by switching from copper wiring to fiber optics. This will speed up upload and download times, making our systems faster and more efficient.
- 3) Improved security: strengthen our defenses by installing more advanced firewalls.

These will not only better protect us from threats but also include built-in logging to track and monitor suspicious activity.

This redesign would not only bring us up to standards but also make it easier to keep our operations secure, reliable, and reasonably future-proof. The current system is outdated and increasingly vulnerable. Investing in this redesign now will help prevent bigger problems and expenses down the line.

Consider Additional Staff Position

For several decades now, American libraries have been moving from a resource-based model to one increasingly centered on services. We still provide books on shelves, but as the digital information environment has grown, the majority of what we make available to our users is now accessed through highly-specialized online databases. For public law libraries, this has coincided with a shift in our user population. We have gone from predominantly serving legal professionals with some training in legal information resources to serving growing numbers of the general public with little to no training or experience. This has increased the need for assistance from trained legal information professionals.

Public libraries also have increased community outreach efforts to meet people at their point of need and ensure that the public knows of the resources available to them. Staff positions dedicated to outreach can be found at public libraries around the U.S. and Canada and at larger county law libraries in California.

The director and public services librarian have made connections with local non-profit legal service providers, public libraries, and county agencies, but believe a position dedicated primarily to outreach is now needed to accelerate and expand that progress.

Colleagues at other public law libraries report success with hybrid positions that combine outreach coordination and reference service. While the position's primary responsibilities would include interfacing with other service providers, organizing educational programming, and authoring publicity materials, it would also include some traditional reference services. This has the dual benefit of increasing the number of research service providers at the library while also giving the outreach coordinator first-hand experience with patron needs.

Reference librarians are at Range 24 on the library's salary schedule. See attached. Next fiscal year, that range will be earning between \$78,948-96,031, depending on experience. The estimate for total salaries that year is \$1.35M. The hiring of an additional reference librarian would increase that number by about 6%, as new hires are typically brought in at Step 1 or 2. The final estimate for total salaries would be between \$1.43-1.44M.

If the board authorizes the additional position, staff will provide a job description for its review.

Action required: motion to approve additional staff position.

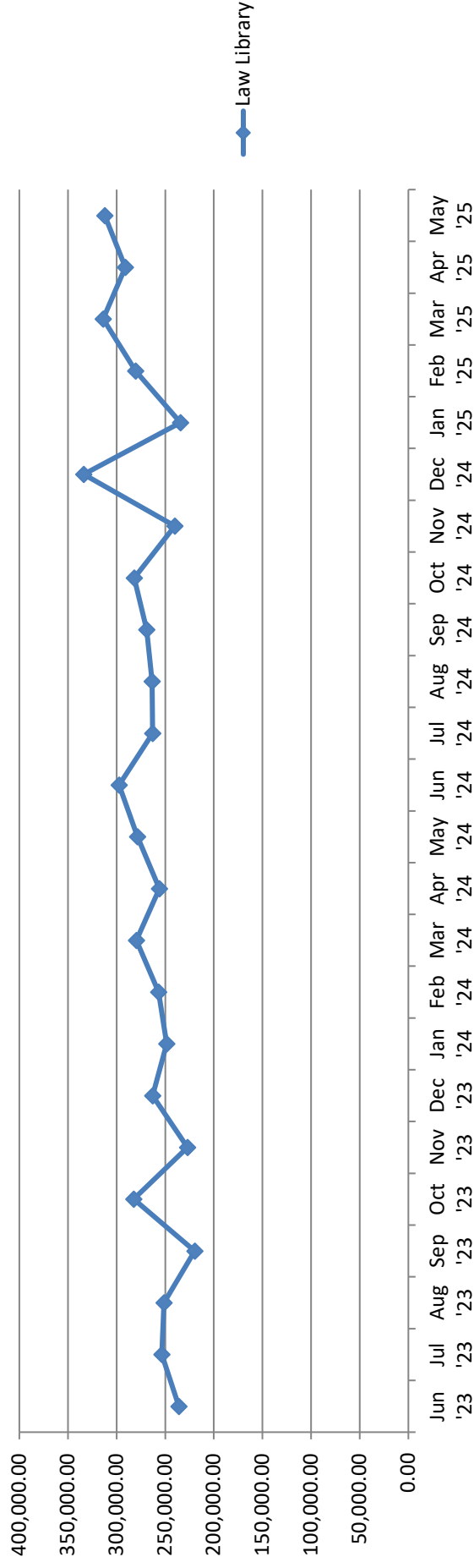
